STANFORDIAN TO ATTEND HARVARD SIPHO KINGS [MATRIC 2004]

Sipho Kings [2004] has been selected to join an elite group of 24 journalists from around the globe who will constitute the Nieman Class of 2018 at Harvard University, Cambridge Massachusetts. Sipho is currently the environment reporter at the Mail & Guardian in Johannesburg.



He will examine how Africa's carbon emitters plan to lower their emissions and help populations adapt to the changing climate. The research will compare plans to national capabilities and the feasibility of each, making alternate recommendations where possible. As an Alumnus of Stanford Lake College, we congratulate Sipho on this prestigious recognition! His studies at the Nieman Foundation at Harvard will be for a year, beginning in September 2017.

ATHLETICS REPORT

During the April school holidays, Stanford had two athletes competing at the SA Schools Athletics. Mfumo Mongwe competed in the 200m for Boys u/19 and finished 5th in his heat. Lia Revelas competed in the 300m Hurdles for Girls u/15 and finished 2nd in her heat, which meant she qualified to go through to the finals. In the finals, Lia finished 5th overall in South Africa for girls u/15 (pictured below). Well done, Lia!!

Stanford then had four athletes competing at the SA Club Championships held at Greenpoint Stadium in Cape Town. Lesedi Motumi took part in the Triple Jump for girls u/18; Mfumo Mongwe ran the 100m, 200m and Relay for Men's u/20; Mafanedza Maiwashe competed in the 200m for boys u/18 and Lia Revelas, although u/15, qualified for the girls' u/18 400m Hurdles. These athletes performed well over a very long athletics season.
