


TRITECH PROJECTS

These pictures represent some of the Tritech projects completed by our Grade 8 & 9 pupils for the 'school round' in preparation for the Regional Tritech competition. The competition provides the opportunity for pupils to be extremely inventive and practise a number of skills such as communication, inquisitiveness, problem-solving and self-awareness. The pupils are 100% responsible for their individual projects and come up with their own idea that can be based on any topic of interest. They then investigate their idea through applicable experiments, or complete an engineering design to test their hypothesis. The students apply the scientific method to their project and use their results to synthesise a conclusion and finally communicate how their project could assist a relevant community. Their courage is then tested when presenting their project to the class and the teacher. We have had some fantastic projects this year and we hope to see lots of participation in the upcoming competition.
