GROWTH MINDSET WORKSHOP ATTENDED BY SLC TEACHERS

Mr Craig Carolan, Ms Amy Taylor, Mr Steve Willson, Mr Michael Swann, Mrs Emma Thompson and I were privileged enough to attend a Growth Mindset Workshop hosted by Thinking Schools South Africa, at Kingsmead College in Johannesburg last week on Tuesday. The workshop was facilitated by James Anderson, a Growth Mindset trainer and author of "The Agile Learner ~ Where Growth Mindset, Habits of Mind and Practice Unite!". It was pleasing to discover that, although we don't use the term explicitly, Stanford Lake College does indeed demonstrate a Growth Mindset. One of the key points that Anderson made was that having a growth mindset is a continuum and that, as adults, we should be guiding the children in our care towards a higher growth orientation. He also emphasised that, as a community of teachers, parents and children we should all be striving towards building an understanding that, with virtuous practice, mature habits of mind and a strong growth mindset, the product of our education system will be agile learners. That is, they will be able to take advantage of opportunities that come their way because they view themselves as capable of gaining the necessary skills even if they don't have them yet.
