On Monday the Grade 9s had Aptitude Testing with Lianza Pretorius, a Psychometrist from Polokwane

On Tuesday & Wednesday, they had a course in etiquette training with Riandi Conradi, owner and trainer at the South African Etiquette Academy in Johannesburg. The students were given an overview of how to conduct themselves in a variety of scenarios from potential job interviews to fine dining, from travelling the world to how to say an off-the-cuff thank you speech.

On Thursday, the students engaged in a number of activities requiring problem-solving skills, teamwork and tenacity in a Growth Mindset workshop. The focus of this was "win or learn" in the context of the Round Square Discovery Framework Discoveries.
