CRICKET MATCH REPORTS

The u/15 boys played against a Phalaborwa Development team on 4th August. Stanford won the toss and bowled first. It could be seen early on that the visitors would have a tough day out. In the end they were bowled out for 60 runs, with Abe Athanassiades and Luca Wasley both taking 3 wickets. They were well supported by Devon Coad taking 2 wickets. Luca Wasley also contributed 21 runs with the bat and Stanford won the game by 4 wickets.

On 7th August both the u/15 and 1st teams played against Merensky. The u/15's played at home, winning the toss and fielding first. Merensky scored 164 for 6 in their allotted 30 overs. Abe Athanassiades was the pick of the bowlers' performances, taking 2 wickets for 16 runs in his 6 overs. Lloyd Lombard, Ethan Jones, Luca Wasley and Christian Kruger also contributed nicely, all taking 1 wicket each. Stanford started the attack slowly, but steadily put on the pressure when Luca Wasley and Abe Athanassiades made an 83 run partnership before Luca was caught on 36. Abe went on to score 57 off 65 balls. Stanford managed to score 147 for 6 in their allotted 30 overs. The team played well and it was a nail-biter with Stanford losing by 17 runs.

The 1st team played away at Merensky. The home team won the toss and put Stanford in to bat. It was a tough day out batting with the Badgers being bowled out for 121. Thomas Mayes top scored with 46 and he was well supported by Christian Schmidt with 41. Merensky went in to bat and finished on 125/9. The bowlers did well with Jackson Ndhlovu taking 5 wickets for 23 runs, Lance Trueman 3 for 33 and Thomas Mayes 1 for 29. Stanford lost the game by 1 wicket. The game had everybody on the edge of their seats.
