

Matters of Principal

"To everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven."
- Ecclesiastes 3:1

As we approach the end of the school year, it's easy to think of each day as a straight path toward a goal. We think of our studies, achievements, and challenges as stepping stones moving us in a single direction. But as writer Robert Black reminds us, life is not a straight line. Life is cyclic, repeating and unfolding like the seasons. It has patterns that reappear, giving us a chance to revisit lessons, rediscover our values, and reflect on how past choices shape our present and future. Recognising these cycles can make us more resilient and wiser, helping us to better navigate life's challenges with open minds.

Cycles exist everywhere: in nature, history and personal growth. Just as the seasons come and go, bringing change yet always returning, history, too, has patterns that echo through time. Events from long ago, like struggles for power or battles over beliefs, might seem like distant events, but they have a way of resurfacing in modern forms. Being aware of these cycles can encourage us to learn from history, avoiding the mistakes of the past and fostering understanding and compassion. We have had a few disciplinary issues in the school over the past few weeks, as with so many things these too appear to be cyclical. Every now and again we need to reset and take stock of where we are on our journey of growth.

On Wednesday I held a special assembly where I reminded the school of our values and what we stand for as a community, that our actions have consequences and that so often poor choices throw us off track. I mentioned to the school that we need to take the learnings from these issues and simply "be better" and base what we do and how we behave on principles of dignity and respect. In our school community, let's use this perspective to see how we're part of a bigger picture, one that connects us to each other and to the world. At Stanford we are educating young men and women to be actively and positively involved in our community, so we must never underestimate the gravity of this responsibility. We need to continually reinforce our values, standards and expectations both at school and at home. As human beings, every setback or triumph is part of our journey, throwing us off the straight path towards a goal but giving us the chance to pause, reflect, learn and grow wiser.

Embracing life's lessons and setbacks encourages patience, humility and persistence, teaching us that true progress isn't about rushing forward. Instead, it's about moving thoughtfully, with the courage to revisit, learn and renew. Let's keep these ideas close to our hearts as we approach the remainder of the year.
